



**What is David eating

At a clean autumn night, parents took their children for a walk in the park after dinner.




David and his parents also went to the park for a walk. He came across his friend, Fred, and joyfully went up to say hello.

” Can you really guess? Come on! Quickly tell me what I ate for dinner tonight,” said David with great curiosity.




“Hmm! You had cabbage and squid for dinner tonight, right?” Fred said after he pretended to think.”


How do you know? I don’t believe you’re that good. We’ll do it again tomorrow night.” David said surprisingly.




The next following day, parents took their children for a walk in the park after dinner as usual.




Fred saw David, and again pretended to be Sherlock Holmes and said, “Hmm! You had corn and eggs today, right?”



David was in awe. “How did he know? Wow, no way! He knows everything that is going on at my home.” He thought to himself.




David told his mother in fear. She also thought it was very strange.




Question: Children, can you guess how Fred found out what David had eaten?

Answer:


- A. David hasn't thoroughly cleaned his teeth

- D. Fred peeped while David was having dinner






**“But I brush every morning and evening!”
